

ADOPTION STATEMENT – SOUTH EAST LINCOLNSHIRE LOCAL PLAN 2011-2036

In accordance with Regulations 26 and 35 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012, notice is hereby given that the South East Lincolnshire Joint Strategic Planning Committee adopted the South East Lincolnshire Local Plan 2011-2036 on 8th March 2019.

The South East Lincolnshire Local Plan 2011-2036 was submitted to the Secretary of State for examination on 23rd June 2017. Planning Inspectors Anne Napier BA (Hons) MRTPI MIEMA CEnv and Elizabeth Ord LLB (Hons) LLM MA DipTUS were appointed by the Secretary of State to undertake the examination. Public hearing sessions were held between 10th October 2017 and 26th April 2018.

The Inspectors' Report was issued on 29th January 2019. It concluded that the South East Lincolnshire Local Plan 2011-2036 is sound and legally compliant subject to the incorporation of 38 main modifications. The adopted version of the South East Lincolnshire Local Plan 2011-2036 incorporates all the main modifications required by the Inspectors.

Any person aggrieved by the adoption of the South East Lincolnshire Local Plan 2011-2036 may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the grounds that:

- a) the document is not within the appropriate power; or
- b) a procedural requirement has not been complied with.

Any such application must be made within six weeks starting from the date of adoption (date of adoption was 8th March 2019)
